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NURSING SCHOOL REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATION/MANAGEMENT OF ASSESSMENT

The management of assessment and its mode of conduct for each institution shall be those approved by the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare, TNMS/NACTE.

12.1 END OF SEMESTER EXAMINATION

- i. Each module taught in a semester will be examined separately at the end of semester.
- ii. A candidate will be eligible for the end of semester examination if she/he has successfully passed continuous assessments for each module.
- iii. A student who fails to attain 50% of continuous assessment for each core modules shall not be allowed to sit for semester examination. All modules are regarded as core modules shall not be allowed to sit for semester examination. All modules are regarded as core module with the exception of computer applications and entrepreneurship modules.
- iv. A student who did not sit for the semester examination for any module, shall have to do the examination for that module before progressing towards next semester.
- v. A student who attains GPA of 2.0 should be allowed to supplement the failed module once not later than four weeks.
- vi. A student who fails semester examination with GPA less than 2.0 should be discontinued from the programme.
- vii. A student who fails any core module after supplementary in NTA level 4 shall the discontinued
- viii. Any score after supplementary shall be counted at 50% regardless the actual score
- ix. A student who fails the semester examination for any module after repeating shall be suspended and reinstated into the programmed at the start of the next semester.

- x. A student who fails the theory or practical examination for any module will be allowed to sit for supplementary examination not later than 4 weeks after the first attempt.
- xi. The student who fails supplementary examination for any module shall be suspended and allowed to repeat the semester.
- xii. Students will be allowed to progress towards the next semester if she/he has passed all semester examinations for each module.
- xiii. A candidate who falls seriously sick just before or during end of semester examinations or is hospitalized will be allowed to write the examinations when his/her health has stabilized.
- xiv. A candidate who feels unable to attempt end of semester examination for any module for any reason, should present her case in writing four weeks before the date of end of semester examination to the head of an institution for consideration
- xv. A candidate will be deemed to have passed the end of semester examination if she/he achieves a minimum 50% of the set marks for both theory and practical/oral or the aggregates of continuous assessment and end of semester examination for each core module.

12.2 EXAMINATION COMPONENTS CONTRIBUTION

Contribution of every component of the assessment to the final mark shall be as follows:

13.3 Examination appeals

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LABORATORY SCHOOL EXAMINATION REGULATION

7.3.1 Regulations for examination

The management of assesment and its mode of conduct for each medical laboratory science training institution shall be those which indicated in this curriculum and approved by the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare and NACTE.

7.3.2 End of Semester Examinations

- (a) Each module taught in a semester will be examined separately at the end of semester.
- (b) A candidate will be eligible for the end of semester examination if she/he has successfully passed continuous assessment tests for each module.
- (c) A student who fails to attain 50% of continuous assessment for each module shall not be allowed to sit for semester examination and he/she will have to repeat the module.
- (d) The student who did not sit for the semester examination for any module, shall have to do the examination for that module (when next offered) before progressing towards next semester.
- (e) A student will be deemed to have passed the end of semester examination if she/he achieves a minimum of 50% marks as an aggregate of theory, and practical/oral of continuous assessment and end of semester examination. For practical examination(s) the minimum of 50% marks is compulsory.
- (f) Any candidate who has a semester I GPA of 2.0 or above shall be allowed to continue to semester II. If the failed any module will continue to semester II and do t he supplementary examination of the same while he/she is in the second semester. The supplementary examination of the failed module(s) must be done in 4 weeks from the date of declaration of end of semester examination results. If fails again he/she suspended and allowed to repeat a failed module. A candidate who failed a repeated module(s) will be discontinued from studies.
- (g) Any candidate who has a semester II GPA of 2.0 or above and has failed any module will be allowed to sit for supplementary examination of the failed module(s) in four weeks from the date of declaration of end of semester II examination results. If fails again he/she will be suspended and allowed to repeat a failed module. A candidate who failed a repeated module(s) will be discontinued form studies.

- (h) A student who fails end of semester examination with GPA of less than 2.0 should be discontinued from studies.
- (i) A student who falls seriously sick just before or during end of semester examinations and is hospitalized will be allowed to write the examinations when his/her health has stabilized.
- (j) A student with genuine reasons who unable to attempt end of semester examination for any module for any reason, should present her case in writing two weeks before the date of end of semester examination to the head of an institution for consideration. She/he will be allowed to attempt the end of semester examination when next offered.
- (k) A candidate with genuine reasons raised just before or during end of semester examination should be allowed to sit special examination within four weeks after declaration of end semester examination.

7.3.3 Examination Components Contribution

Contribution of every component of the assessment to the final mark shall be as follows:

(a) Continuous Assessment %

7.3.4 Disposal of Failed Candidates

- (a) A student who fails end of semester examination with GPA of less than 2.0 should be discontinued from studies.
- (b) A candidate who failed a repeated module(s) will be discontinued from studies

7.3.5 Examination Appeals

The appeal of candidates, who has not satisfied the examiners, should follow the process described in the training regulation of the MOHSW.
